

Irrigation Project

The Town has completed a project to install several access manholes on the main water supply pipeline that runs from the diversion structure in the National Park to Springdale. These manholes will allow cleaning crews to scour debris and sediment from the water supply pipe.

We anticipate this cleaning to occur later this year as the tourist season winds down. It's anticipated that the cleaning will be done during the non-watering hours of the day. However, debris, silt and sand may be dislodged into the system. We'll post and email notices when the cleaning is to be done so property owners are aware and can take steps to shut off their irrigation systems if necessary.

Plants and Trees vs Sidewalks and Streets

We've been made aware of several locations where trees and plants are growing from private property across the public rights of way (sidewalks and streets). Please take a look at your properties and if you have tree branches that are getting in the way of vehicles (cars, trucks, garbage trucks, etc.) or plants and other vegetation that are blocking or impacting the sidewalks, please arrange to trim them so they don't impact people or vehicles.

Thanks for your assistance in keeping the streets and sidewalks safe for traveling.

Zion Canyon Music Festival, promoting solar power in Southern Utah

It's that time of year again. The sixth annual Zion Canyon Music Festival will be held on September 26th and 27th, 2014. Once again, the canyon will be filled with music from both nationally recognized and local musicians, including Coco Montoyo, Bastard Sons of Johnny Cash, The Record Company, Coral Thief, Many Miles, Juniper City, Lyonhead, and Jason Tyler Burton and Friends.

We are working toward making this festival sustainable and zero waste. Since 2010, the Festival has relied on solar arrays to help offset the power used by the festival. Power used at the festival is offset by a 1 kW net-metered, fixed solar array installed at the venue. Additionally, a local solar trailer company provides solar power for all of the vendor booths.

Please take the opportunity to visit the many art and craft, outdoor recreation and educational/non-profit vendors that attend the festival each year. Food at the festival will be provided by Wildcat Willie's, Roadrunner Pizza, Deep Creek Coffee, Pinching Gringos Tacos, and Waffle Bliss. Wasatch/Squatters Beers will also be providing handcrafted beer and wine will be available.

Saturday September 27th at 3 pm will be the festival's 2nd Annual drum Circle with Andy Jones. Andy works with the Africa Heartwood Project which is a grassroots non-profit seeking to redress causes and symptoms of poverty in West Africa - See more at: <http://www.africaheartwoodproject.org>. Bring the kids, drums and noise makers and enjoy the weekend in spectacular Zion Canyon.

Admission to the festival is \$5 per person per day for those 21 years old and older. Those younger than 21 are still free to attend. That's a great price for over 8 hours of fabulous music.



