From the Mayor's Desk

Houses, Everybody Needs One

A major part of what makes the town of Springdale such a special place is the people who live here. Springdale residents are a diverse group coming from wide ranging backgrounds and with divergent opinions, perspectives and life experiences. This diversity adds richness to the community. This diversity is possible because, in the past, there has been a corresponding diversity in housing types and affordability allowing people from many walks of life and economic backgrounds the ability to live in town.

Over the past decade housing in Springdale has become much more expensive. It is now difficult for the people who work in the hotels, restaurants, and shops to be able to live in town. Young families have a hard time finding housing that fits both their budget and the needs of their kids. More and more the town is becoming less and less diverse in age and income due to the increased cost of housing. This threatens the rich diversity the town has historically enjoyed.

The Planning Commission is currently working on the Housing chapter of the general plan. They are talking about concepts of accessory dwelling units (small mother-in-law apartments or guesthouses rented on a long term basis) and cottage neighborhoods (small homes clustered together in a common development) as a means to provide more diversity in the type and cost of housing. They are looking for other ideas to address the Town's housing needs.

These are important discussions that will impact the nature and character of the community in the future. I encourage you to be a part of the discussion. Let the Commission know how you feel about housing in the town and if housing affordability is an issue you care about.

Ross Clay

The Town of Springdale recently selected Ross Clay as the 2015 Summer Citizen of the Season. As a volunteer, business owner and treasurer of the Zion Canyon Visitors Bureau, Ross has been an integral part of the community fabric for dozens of years. There is much more to this wonderful man than many may know however. His daughter Rosalyn recently shared some details of his life.

Ross grew up in Price and was the youngest of three siblings. His father was a local lawyer with a penchant for standing up for the little guy. His mother was patient and kind. Ross remembers his childhood as a safe and happy time. During the 1960's he ran his own advertising agency.

Ross always had a love for Zion and even worked at the Lodge when he was 19. He often brought his family to the area and upon retirement in 1992 settled in Springdale permanently. He opened the Novel House Bed and Breakfast with his wife Norma. Ross admittedly didn't come to get rich, he came for the lifestyle and for the opportunity to be part of one of the last great small towns. He truly loved Springdale.

Ross was a history buff and extremely well-read. At one point he got into bread making and became a fantastic baker. The kitchen may have been a mess when he was finished, but the end result was worth it! Ross also enjoyed photography. He had a great eye for composition.

Ross was a tall man with a strong presence. He may have seemed intimidating but was quiet, gentle and witty. He was a fabulous granddad and always found time for family.

Springdale was deeply saddened to lose Ross on October 12th. He was laid to rest at the Jolley-Gifford Cemetery in a beautiful spot overlooking the Watchman and near where his family can continue to feel his presence.

Ross will be dearly missed, but his legacy as an honest, genuine and generous human being will live on.






