A Word About Farmers Markets & Community Gardens

There are over 8000 farmers markets and thousands of community gardens in the United States. With interest in healthy living and knowledge of our food source, many residents want to support these activities in Zion Canyon. Zion Harvest, a non-profit for the Zion Canyon Farmers Market and Community Garden, has a mission to support citizens through educational programs and direct experience in farmers markets, community gardens and other activities related to local gardening and personal food production. The Springdale General Plan strategies continue to support the farmers market and encourage other locations for community gardens. In its 11th year, our local farmers market, held from May to October on the lawn of the Bit & Spur Restaurant, has hosted many different vendors who sell a variety of seasonal produce, honey, bread, eggs, and meat; agricultural crafts such as soap and hand spun yarn; and limited arts and crafts. The 10 year old community garden hosted by the Town is next to the tennis courts. Over the years, more than 50 residents have donated their time to build this needed resource that allows residents from Town and the National Park to grow their own produce where they otherwise might not have the opportunity.


