From the Mayor's Desk

Sylvia Gifford was a sweet lady who every week would go around town looking to collect the "news" of Springdale to put in the *Washington County News*. She would stop by and ask what had happened the past week. She was paid by the word so she didn't accept you telling her that there was no news.

Going back and reading some of those early news articles sheds some light on life in Springdale in the early years. From August 19, 1899 in the *Washington County News* it read: "Fruit drying in full blast. We are anxious to have our grain threshed. Ed Allred and Moses Gifford have just returned from Long Valley with lumber. Frank Petty has started for Mount Trumbul with the new saw. The sawmill will start up at once. Brother Hepworth is home from Idaho. He is going to sell out here and move his family to Idaho in the fall." The weather, crops and visitors were the common theme in most all of the news. In a lot of ways the news of Springdale hasn't changed very much.

We have been working with the Paiute Tribe regarding their property for almost two years. This month at the Town Council meeting we will be reviewing a memorandum of understanding that the two parties have drafted. I still am asked about a casino. Utah State law bans casinos even on sovereign land, so that is not something the Paiutes have ever asked to build. They would like to build a museum & cultural center, gift shop, restaurant and dormitory to house their employees. The goal of the two Councils is to have a place where the Tribe can educate and tell their history of the canyon, and from the town's position is something that will be consistent with the General Plan.

The weather is hot, the crops are growing and we have a lot of visitors. While some things change, the news pretty much remains the same.

Foil, tin and steel cans	No clothes or cloth products

If BluCan waste is contaminated the County must sort using a different process and much of the contents will likely end up in the landfill and not recycled. Help make the program a success by only including what is listed above in your BluCan.

SR-9 Reconstruction Project News




OPEN HOUSE OVERVIEW

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) held a public open house for the SRP-9 project on Thursday, May 12th at the Canyon Community Center. Approximately 40 people consisting of community members, residents and business owners, were in attendance. The project team discussed the anticipated schedule and gave an overview of the planned improvements. Additionally, the team presented how rock-lined gutters would be maintained, modified or removed at various locations throughout the project. The project team would like to thank everyone that attended for their feedback and insight. PROJECT SCHEDULE CHANGE

An updated project schedule was presented at the public open house. Originally, the project team anticipated that construction would be completed in one construction phase, October 2016 to April 2017. As the team evaluated the design further, it was determined that one construction phase would not be sufficient for the contractor to complete all of the work items. Therefore, the project team has decided to split the construction into two phases; the first will be from January 2017 to April 2017 and the second will be October 2017 to February 2018. The intent of the split is to allow the contractor to complete work in Rockville and in the shoulder widening area before beginning the reconstruction in Springdale.




