The Town Council and staff are also in the process of budgeting for the next fiscal year. Springdale's budget is reaching upwards of 3 million dollars this year. With the streetlight project, the SR 9 renewal project and the water treatment upgrade a lot of money is being spent. We want you to be aware and informed of these projects and are holding several meetings during the coming months. We encourage you to come out and be knowledgeable on what is going to be happening and ask the questions that are on your mind.

Springdale is a great place to ride a bike. May is National Bike Month. Take some time this month to enjoy the bike riding opportunities in the Town. The paved trail from the Chevron to the Sanctuary Ranch is a fun, family-friendly bike ride. For off-road enthusiasts, the town single track trail behind the cemetery offers a convenient trail ride. Riding the Pa'rus trail and Zion Canyon Scenic Drive in the Park is always an enjoyable experience.

Riding bikes will benefit you with increased health and reduced transportation costs. Riding bikes will benefit the community with reduced parking and traffic congestion and cleaner air.

The Town will be creating additional infrastructure to support cycling in the near future. Look for more paved trail connections, bike lanes on SR-9, and widened shoulders between Rockville and Springdale coming in the next year.

Whether you are a driver, a cyclist, or both, please be courteous and respectful to other road users. Take time to become familiar with bike related traffic laws. In general:

- *Drivers: Cyclists are allowed to ride on the road and in the travel lane. Respect their right to be there. Slow down and give cyclists ample room when passing (at least three feet). Be courteous and respectful to cyclists.*
- *Cyclists: Ride as far to the right of the road as possible, but beware of parked cars and other roadside hazards. Ride single file when impeding the flow of traffic. Be courteous and respectful to drivers.*

Police Corner

The Springdale Police Department is asking for your help to make sure your home and/or business has the address numbers attached to the building.

In the event of an emergency, it is vital that your house numbers be visible enough so that the police, fire department, and paramedics can quickly locate your property. House numbers are often the only way that first-responders can identify their intended destinations. Having the numbers attached on your home/business allows emergency responders to have less delay in their response time. A majority of numbers are not visible from the street. A poorly displayed number or no number at all can cost precious time in the event of an emergency.



Follow these tips to help save time for response:

- Building identification should be placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property from both directions of travel.
- These numbers should contrast with their background.
- Where access is by means of private road and the building cannot be viewed from the public way, a monument, pole or other sign or means should be used to identify the structure.
- Keep trees, bushes and vegetation trimmed so they do not block the view of the number.
- Keep House numbers clean, numbers may not be reflective or contrasting if they are covered in dirt.

SR-9 Reconstruction Project News



OVERVIEW

The Utah Department of Transportation is currently designing improvements to SR-9 from Rockville to Zion National Park. The design phase will continue through late summer with construction anticipated to begin in October 2016. The project includes roadway resurfacing in Rockville, shoulder widening between Rockville and Springdale and roadway reconstruction through Springdale. Additionally, the project team is working with the Towns of Springdale and Rockville to evaluate elements such as on-street parking, bicycle lanes and drainage.

PUBLIC MEETING

The project team will hold a public open house to present the planned improvements and gather public feedback. We encourage all interested parties to attend to learn more about the project and the proposed construction timing.

No formal presentations will be given, please arrive any time during the two hour block to view project materials and speak with team members.


