From the Mayor's Desk ...

On October 26th Zion National Park held a public scoping meeting at the Community Center. It gave Springdale residents and others the opportunity to consider and comment on the Park's proposed strategies concerning visitor use management. The event was well attended. As we prepare for the SR9 renewal project there will be opportunities for the public to attend meetings and give input to UDOT. The public can also provide comments to the Planning Commission. The Commission is working on a number of issues that affect the Town and input from residents is important and vital to what happens here in Springdale. Sometimes people feel their input isn't heard because the Council or Commission didn't vote the way they preferred. Springdale is very diverse and many opinions are expressed. Some people are very public and vocal while others are more quiet but just as passionate. All opinions are taken into consideration when decisions are made. Construction on Phase 1 of the SR9 renewal project will begin in Rockville this January. Phase 2, which includes Springdale, is scheduled to begin sometime in October 2017. Changes are going to happen. Not everyone likes change in their life but, as you have the opportunity, it is important to attend the different meetings and express your concerns.

Water Treatment Plant Project & Water Rate Increase


During last month's Town Council meeting, the Council approved a bond resolution that will provide funding for the new water treatment plant currently under design. The new plant design is expected to be finalized this winter, go through the design approval process with the Planning Commission, and be under construction by late Spring. The bond approval secures funding through the State of Utah Division of Drinking Water's (DDW) revolving loan program. The total cost of the plant will be about \$5.5 million. Of this total amount, the State DDW approved a funding package of \$3.856 million at 1.25% interest for 30 years and a grant of \$1.652 million.

Repayment of the loan will be through water rates and based on existing customer usage. Rate increases will be necessary to make the first loan payment which is due October 2018. During the approval of the funding resolution, the Council discussed the increases necessary to generate the additional \$84,000 per year needed to make the loan payment. This equates to a 15 percent overall increase in the water rates.

With three fiscal years between now and when the first payment will be due, the Council determined a stepped increase will be imposed. The first step will be considered by the Council in January 2017 and will likely be a 5 percent increase. The 5 percent is slightly higher than the 3 percent anticipated (this being the third year of our 3 percent every 3 year pattern). This increase is equal to about \$1.46 per month for a property using 3,000 gallons per month and \$21.47 per month for a property using 50,000 gallons per month. We anticipate three years of stepped increases to get the water fund in a position to make the necessary payment for the new plant.

Some have stated new hotels and new businesses should pay for the new plant, but the new water treatment facility will benefit the entire community. The current plant is 30 years old, reaching capacity during the busy season and lacks redundancy. The Council determined it is in everyone's best interest to replace the current plant with a new plant that will serve the entire town and provide high quality culinary water for the next 30-40 years. Unfortunately, we have a small community with only 350 water connections. While the hotels, restaurants and other high water users pay the largest share of the water fund expenses, including the debt service on the new plant, all customers will pay their share based on usage. As the vast majority of residential users are in the bottom usage tier, they will be the least affected. Please contact the Town Office if you have any questions regarding the funding for the new water treatment plant.


- The BluCan Recycling Program collects an average of 400,000 tons of recycled material each month in Washington County
