Overview




- 9 crew members from the Utah Conservation Core

- Removal was completed in River Park, on private land owned by the Paiute Tribe, and several other privately owned lands
- Russian olive and tamarisk were cut, sprayed with herbicide, and either chipped or scattered




Legend

What's Next?

- Map areas of infestation located within Springdale (Winter 2015)
- Apply for additional funding through the Utah Watershed Restoration Initiative (Winter 2015).
- Revegetate where necessary in 2014 treatment areas (early Spring 2015)
- Begin first phase of removal (Summer/Fall 2015)
- Retreat 2014 treatment areas (Fall 2015)
- Restoration Hands On Clinic for Private Landowners (2015)
